

Black Bear G.C. Hole Names

The names of our holes correspond to the Ojibwe (Chippewa) term for the number of the hole. Example: bezhig = one, niizh = 2, niswi = 3 and so on.

Ojibwe is the heritage language of more than 200,000 Ojibwe people who reside in the United States and Canada. Ojibwe Country primarily extends from Quebec, across Ontario and Manitoba to Saskatchewan in Canada, and from Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota and North Dakota in the United States. Ojibwe is an endangered language. Ojibwe people understand that fluent speakers of the language have a wisdom that represents an accumulated knowledge of many generations. The Ojibwe language can explain why we must respect the earth and take responsibility for caring for the land, water, and its resources.

Black Bear G.C. is owned and operated by the Fond du Lac Band of Lake Superior Chippewa.

The Black Bear Golf Course Local Rules

U.S.G.A. Rules govern all play except where modified by local rules as listed below:

All wooded or marsh areas that border holes are played as red penalty areas. Under penalty of one stroke you may:

1. Drop a ball within two club lengths of the point of entry.

Play from the spot of your last shot. (There is no LINE OF FLIGHT relief).

- 2. Free drop from cart paths and sprinkler heads.
- 3. Free drop from all native carvings on course if they interfere with your stance, swing or lie.

Fairway Yardage Markers: Red - 100; White - 150; Blue - 200

Black Bear Golf Course Policies:

- No fivesomes and only two riders per cart.
- No outside alcoholic beverages or coolers are allowed.
- Children under the age 16 are not allowed to operate golf carts.
- Please fill your divots with the sand & seed provided in the carts.
- Please repair your ball marks on the greens.
- Golf carts and walking carts must stay on the cart path when near all tee boxes and greens.
- Please allow faster groups to play through.
